JOHN G. SMITH*

John G. SMITH, called Jack, was born and married in Walton Co., GA. His parents were not known to this compiler.* It appears he had a brother Mial SMITH, and perhaps a brother William. He was living in Marion Co., GA when their first 3 children were born, then in Muscogee Co., GA when the next 4 were born. After the 1850 census was taken, they moved to Bienville Parish, LA where all his other children were born.

He was one of the charter members of a Primitive Baptist Church in Columbus, Muscogee Co., GA, believed to be 6 miles north of City Hall on Double Church Rd., called Mt. Mariah. When they were in LA his daughter Sarah Ann SMITH was baptized by Brother Zachariah Thomas when she was 18. Her father "Jack" was a deacon in the church.

Jack was not too tall, fair and blue-eyed. He had his share of problems, losing his wife and mother of 8 children when the youngest was but a baby. He got busy and found a young widow with 3 small children and married Julia Ann Smith SPINKS. (Relationship not known, if any.) He and Julia Ann had three more children and she died leaving all these children for him to care for. Of course the older ones were married and were able to help him some. In 1865 he married another widow who had 2 children by her first husband. Mary Elizabeth Daniel STEWART. Mary Elizabeth had 7 more children. Jack was made guardian of George G. Stewart and Elizabeth Fannie Stewart, 21 Sept 1870, "their father having died several years before."

The family all lived in Sparta, which at that time was the Parish seat. When the railroads came in they by-passed the town and the folks gradually moved to other areas. The family home was then above Ringgold.

In his older days he loved to get on his horse, with a sheep skin across its back and travel around visiting his children and grandchildren and great-grandchildren. He loved telling them stories. One story they never tired of was when he was younger and was riding his horse, a panther attacked the horse, clawing him badly. Mr. Jack went to the house and got his gun and found the panther and killed him. However, the horse died. The children would get him hard rock candy, from sugar can molasses, which he loved.

Tradition was that he was the father of 21 children. However, we only have records of eighteen. The step-children that he raised may have been counted in that figure. I'm sure he has hundreds of descendants scattered around the world.

WILLIAM T. SMITH**

William T. Smith was in the U.S. Civil War, Navy. Third Assistant Engineer, 5 Feb 1862. Served on C.S.S. Pontchartrain MS River Defenses 1862-63. C.S.S. Huntsville, Mobile Squadron, 1863-64. C.S.S. W. H. Webb, Red River Defenses 1864-65; captured 24 Apr 1865.

Brittain (Briton) SMITH appears on the 1850 Census of Walton Co., GA as a 72 year old farmer born in North Carolina. His wife Nancy, age 65, also born in North Carolina and probably a daughter Elizabeth, age 31, are listed as members of his household. We know from this that Brittain was born about 1778 and Nancy about 1785. We do not know where in North Carolina they were from or where they were married.

There is a record in Oglethorpe County, GA of a marriage of a Brittain SMITH and a Nancy CARDEN which took place on 24 Dec 1803. William SMITH, a son of Brittain SMITH, named a daughter Mary Ann Carden SMITH. Thus, indications are that this may be the marriage of our ancestor Brittain SMITH.

Caution must be the rule, however. There are many Brittain SMITHS to be found in various records. We must be very careful to determine which is our ancestor.

The earliest deed granting land to Brittain (Briton) SMITH in Walton Co., GA is dated 16 Apr 1824. However, a Brittain SMITH is listed as a head of a household in Walton County as early as 1820. In the 1820 and 1821 Land Lotteries of GA, Brittain SMITH of Walton Co. drew land lot number 3, section 13 in Monroe Co., GA.

Brittain SMITH's will is recorded in Walton Co., GA Annual Returns Book N page 239. In his will he names the following: son John SMITH, son-in-law Isham SMITH, son Joel, son William, son Haley, son Miles, daughter Elizabeth Phillips, son-in-law Washington SIMONTON, John SIMONTON, William SIMONTON, son-in-law Walton P. TRIBBLE.

From Anita B. Sans' WAYFARERS IN WALTON, we are able to find the names of Brittain's daughters to match those sons-in-law named in the will. Thus, the other daughters of Brittain and Nancy were Bidy, Dicy, Liddy, Mary and Nancy SMITH.

Evidently Brittain's wife Nancy had already died at the time of his will for she is not mentioned at all.

Brittain's will is not dated. However, his estate was appraised on 7 Oct 1859. In Book 0 page 273 of Walton County Annual Returns, we find the date of death listed as 22 Sept. 1859. Brittain's son Joel and son-in-law Walton TRIBBLE were to be executors of the will, but Walton TRIBBLE handled all the affairs. Also, Joel is not listed as receiving any money from the estate. Therefore, it is possible that Joel had died before the settlement of the estate or had left Georgia and was no longer in contact with his family.

A letter found in the Carmichael Bible is what really tied our William SMITH down as the son of Brittain SMITH of Walton Co., GA. The letter from John SIMONTON to William SMITH discusses a legal matter of some kind in which Walton TRIBBLE is concerned. This was apparently part of the estate settlement. Also, the letter, written in 1863, mentions Washington SIMONTON, Isham SMITH and Egbert SMITH as people who are apparently known (and more likely) related to William SMITH. The relation between William SMITH and John SIMONTON is shown in the address: "Dear brother".

The Carmichael Bible is the Bible belonging to James Carmichael, father of Nancy Carmichael SMITH. This Bible is in the possession of Earnest Weir, great-grandson of Nancy and William SMITH.

OLIVER BRITTON SMITH

*One of Jack's great-grandsons lives in Vivian, LA and supplied us with a few facts about his family. Oliver was born in Sparta, LA, son of John Britton SMITH, a farmer. He attended grade school at Smith School house, a country school. His first employment was at Price Brothers' Grocery in Homer, LA in 1919 as a salesman. In 1925 he was employed by Dixie Mercantile Co. to go to Smackover AR where a new store was opened. He worked for them for 55 years. He was the Vice President and director in 1978, when they liquidated.

He was transferred to the Haynesville, LA store in 1924, where he met Helen Kathleen DEHNER and was married to her at St. John's Catholic church in Shreveport, LA.

In 1927 he was transferred to Vivian, LA and he later purchased the store in 1949. His two daughters were attending college and he and Helen operated the store. They retired in 1974.

Helen's grandparents had come from Germany, Ireland and France. All successful farmers. Oliver's oldest daughter, Helen Dinah, graduated from Our Lady of the Lake College in San Antonio, TX, with a B.S. degree in Business Administration, and is listed in Who's Who. Helen's daughter Elizabeth Ann was employed as an adviser and office superintendent for a Financial firm before her marriage. Nancy Kathleen was

a debator in Captain Shreve High School and won numerous trophies. She studied law at L.S.U. and is now a practicing attorney. Her husband is also an attorney. They reside in Shreveport, LA. Daughter Helen specializes in art. Judy Louise is at L.S.U. in Baton Rouge, LA.

MARY LOUISE SMITH PLEMMONS

Mary Louise Smith PLEMMONS, daughter of Oliver Britton SMITH, graduated from Our Lady of the Lake College in San Antonio, TX., 3 May 1949 with a degree in Chemistry. She trained as a medical Technologist at Scott and White Hospital. While in Temple, she met Royce "Buddy" Plemmons who was in the Navy. After his discharge, they returned to Austin. They located in Marshall, TX, in 1955. Their daughter Patricia, received her degree in nursing from TX Women's University at Denton. She and her husband Dave ROGERS live in Beaumont. He is a sports writer for the Beaumont Enterprise. Royce is in a training program at People's State Bank, Marshall, TX. Margaret graduated from Marshall High.

MARY SANDERS AND LOUIS SMITH

They lived on Cross Lake in Shreveport, LA. They were first cousins. Mary "Pick" was a daughter of Ellen Leona SMITH. Leona lived near Pick and Louie, so they would go in and visit often and take her some squirrels they had killed or some fish they caught. Cousin Leona's home burned and destroyed all her records, which always bothered her. As she got older, her memory didn't serve her very well. Leona lived to be 86.

E. B. SEALE, SR.

E. B. Seale, Sr., Dallas independent oil operator, and royalty buyer, a realtor, and former member of Pheasant Grove School Board, A native of VanZandt Co., E. B. Seale moved to Dallas in 1922 and became assistant manager of the old Brannon Dry Cleaning Company at Peak and Bryan. He formed the E. B. Seale Insurance Company in 1929, operating it until 1946. Active in church affairs, he was a Baptist. (He was a grandson of John G. SMITH; his mother was Missouri SMITH.) (In 1874 "Celia" Lavvorn moved to Limestone, TX.)

The rest of the family is in usual health- truly hope when this reaches you it may find you all enjoying the good blessing of health. When these lines are received will inform the family connection is all well so far as I know - there is good many deaths thru here-mostly old people-When you get this send it to your ma as I am and don't feel like writting- I think we are having the dryest weather I ever saw- people have got most of the cotten out- we have made a very good crop of corn thru here- Dear Niece, as I havent any news to write that will interest you so I reckon I better come to a close- Hope to hear from you when I can one. I am writing to all- Your Uncle Newel Tullis is dead - he died last July- was one year ago. What is troubling me is my old cough and dropsy. The family joins me in love to you all- Hope to hear from you soon- Your old Uncle until death ? , ? , ? , love

PS, I will send you Sister Pollie, Post Office ? . I have sent your letter to brother Buck to let him know your Post Office.

(These remarks in parenthesis are those of Betty Cutler Barrington...This letter was written to Mr. and Mrs. William Washington Sanders who I presume were residing in Bienville Parish, LA at the time. Mrs. Sanders was Eliza Frances Tullis, daughter of Moses and Mariah H. Maddox Tullis of Monroe, Marion & Muscogee Counties, GA and Bienville Parish, LA. So when S. B. Maddox refers to "your ma", he is referring to his sister Mariah (Maddox) Tullis. Apparently, the letter was given to Mariah, and her trunk with other "Tullis papers" were handed down to her dau. Martha E. Tullis McGlaun (my great-grandmother), and then to her dau. Mittie McGlaun McMahan who, in turn, left it to her dau. Annie McMahan. As of this date, Annie McMahan lives with her sister, Mrs. Katie Scott (Robert M.) of Baytown, TX. 15 May 1979.)

JAMES MOSES TULLIS

James Moses TULLIS was the son of Moses and Mariah Maddox TULLIS, b. 1842, Muscogee Co., GA being the 6th child and the 1st boy. Since his father was a farmer, it was important to have boys to help with the farming. He was a child when the family sold out in Muscogee Co., GA and moved to Louisiana. There were seven families that came together. They used covered wagons to travel in. This was in 1857. No doubt they had some correspondence from the John G. SMITH family who had gone several years before, encouraging them to come. There were plenty of fish and game. Land was easy to get.

James had lived in times of plenty in plantation life with many slaves and now they were having harder times. War was brewing. He joined Co. E, 27th LA Inf. as a Pvt. in New Orleans. 14 Mar 1862 was captured and reported to Shreveport, LA for exchange 1 Apr 1864. He married Sarah Ann SMITH the next month. It was a real struggle for everyone after the war was over.

His wife was Sarah Ann SMITH, daughter of John G. SMITH. Sarah Ann had 9 children. The last two being twins. Sarah was a church going woman, she was baptized when she was 18 by old Brother Zachariah Thomas. She lived a good life, always willing to visit the sick and help in times of need.

James Moses died young leaving a large family for Sarah Ann to raise alone. The oldest boy was 13 and next was Bink, 12. The youngest, twins, were only 2 years old.

Sarah Ann's grandchildren loved to go to see her as she treated them special and made a fuss over them. She had two big black walnut trees and the children would pick up some to take home with them. The older girls showed the grandchildren how to make coverlets, how to card and spin the yarn to make cloth. The children thought Aunt Kate married an old man with some children. Aunt Kate was sick a lot with tuberculosis. She would go visit and stay awhile at her brother "Bink's" home. She lived way down south of the other Tullis families. Perhaps in Jackson Parish, LA. She had three children and she died young in 1913.

Mattie married Lum PATTERSON and died with her first baby, Mattie Mae.

Sarah Ann went to visit Thomas Jefferson, her son and family, and she died there with swamp fever, 17 Jan 1899, having been poorly all fall.

Nealie married Henry Clay McDOUGAL and had 4 children and she died young, leaving her family. Her husband married her sister "Lizzie" and she had 5 children and raised Nealie's 4, all in Texas.

Laura married Elbert McDOUGAL. One day when Kate and Laura were working in the field, Laura thought Elbert threw a dirt clod and hit her shoulder and she waited for him to come out from his hiding place, but he didn't and she looked up to see a buzzard flying overhead!

Lucy TULLIS was about ready to deliver her baby and Mattie came to be with her to watch after the children. She took them off out in the fields and they built goose nests in every conceivable fence corner along the rail fence. When they got home, there was the new baby.

Thomas Jefferson had married and had a large family, seven were born before their grandma died. Then they had 9 more afterwards.

Moses Bailington had married Lucy COTTER and had 4 children when his mother died. They had 4 more later.

William Newell married and had 4 children. They have quite a few descendants.

Sarah Elizabeth "Lizzie" married her sister's widower, Henry Clay McDOUGAL. They lived in Texas.

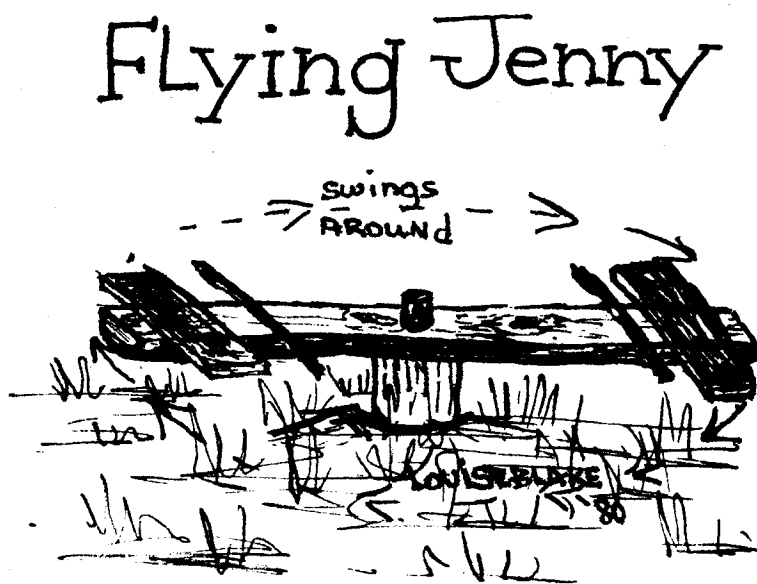

NEWELL TULLIS

⁺Newell TULLIS, son of Moses and Letitia, worked from 2 Oct 1821 for L. E. Delavigne in a mercantile store in a place called Carthedge's Mill in Edgefield District, SC until May 1823. Afterwards moving to Troup Co., GA. He worked as superintendant of the store and did some purchasing of cotton in the neighborhood, collected debts, keeping books and occasionally serving writs.

⁺⁺Newell was in Troup Co., GA in 1830 and 1840 in Coosa Co., AL. He was in Rusk Co., TX for the 1850 Census. He died in Marion Co. TX 1873. He had been a merchant there. It is said he traveled to England every year on buying trips.

Newell was actively engaged in community affairs. Church Hill Community N.E. (9 miles) of Henderson, TX in early 1850. Settlers from GA established plantations, Church Hill Male and Female Academy established in 1854 Newell TULLIS one of the board members.

JOHN BOLIVER TULLIS

Obituary taken from p. 110-111 East Texas Conference 1884 (M.E. Church)

John B. Tullis was born in Edgefield District S.C. 8 Aug 1825. He was the son of Newel Tullis and had 5 brothers and sisters, all of whom died early (Z. notes not all!). In a journal kept by him is the following: "At a camp meeting held at Nixbury, near Wetumpka, Ala. I was born of the Spirit, 4 Oct 1842 (?) On the 14th of the same month I attached myself to the M.E. church, and was licensed to preach 7 Oct 1847; recommended to the annual Conference, and received on trial at Montgomery, in Feb., 1848 and transferred by Bishop Paine to the East Tex. Conference and left in the hands of S. A. Williams, presiding Elder of the San Augustine District. In May following he placed me on the Panola Mission. On this mission I organized and reorganized eight small classes, leaving 84 members in the work." In 1849 he traveled the Upshur Mission, organized a church in the town of Gilmer, with 7 members. He held the first camp meeting which was ever held at old Ft. Crawford, in Harrison County. This year his labors were crowned with success. At the close of the year he was received into full connection in the East Tex. Conference, and ordained deacon by Bishop Paine. In 1850 he traveled the Nacogdoches Circuit, and returned in 1852. At the close of the year he was ordained elder by Bishop Paine. In 1853 and 1854 he filled the Marshall Station. On 14 Nov 1854 he

married Miss Matilda Jane BLAKEMORE of Harrison Co. In 1955 he was stationed at Henderson following affliction, he did not enter upon his work until last of Jan. In his journal he wrote as follows: "I came near leaving this world for a bright home in heaven." The Dallas District was formed this year and he was appointed presiding elder for 3 consecutive years, 1856-8. In 1859-60 he was presiding elder of the Palestine District; in 1861 he was stationed at Marshall; in 1862 he traveled the Harrison Circuit; in 1863-4 he was presiding elder of the Marshall District. On this work his voice failed so as to preclude the possibility of preaching. Here closed his effective labors, which had been most efficient for seventeen years. Dr. Tullis has served as secretary of his conference, as President in the absence of a Bishop and was twice elected a delegate to the General Conference; showing the appreciation of his brethren, as well as their confidence in his ability to serve and fidelity in the discharge of his duties enjoined. In his palmy days he occupied a place in the front ranks and was greatly endeared to his brethren in the ministry and no less so to the people he faithfully served. By a mysterious providence he became disabled in the prime of life and was compelled to "lay his armor by", when he would have most willingly spent a life-time in his Master's service. After he sustained a superannuated relation to his Conference, he applied himself to the study of dentistry, attended lectures at a dental college and qualified himself for the practice of the profession, receiving a liberal share of patronage; and was a contributor to the Ohio Dental Journal. He had 2 sons, Edward the eldest, graduated first at Emory and Henry College and afterwards at Vanderbilt University, which conferred on him the degree of Ph.D. He, too, was a Methodist preacher of much promise. It was a heavy stroke of Providence which called this young, talented, amiable and pious son to his reward in heaven. None felt it more keenly than his sainted father. Little did he think that so soon he would be permitted to reunite with his beloved Edward in praising the God of their salvation. His death occurred at his residence in Marshall, TX on the morning of 19 June last and was doubtless as unexpected to himself as it was to his family and friends, as he had enjoyed his usual health up to a few days before his demise. Our brother is greatly missed at Marshall. His office was a pleasant resort for the preachers visiting the city, who were met with a smile and a cordial reception and pleasantly entertained. He kept posted in affairs of Church and State. While he was not slow to censure wrong doing, he never failed to approve the right. Most of all, he will be missed by his greatly bereaved companion and only son. They are now left to mourn the absence of the one who "shared their sorrows and increased their joys." An appropriate funeral-discourse was delivered at the Methodist Church by the Rev. R. W. Thompson, to a large and sympathizing audience, after which the Masons performed their impressive burial service, led by a Christian brother of the Protestant Episcopal Church. A large concourse of citizens in solemn procession followed his remains to the Marshall Cemetery, where alongside of his deceased son, his remains will repose until all who are in their graves will awake and come to judgement. We cannot but fondly hope that our fallen comrade will have a part in the first resurrection. We extend our sympathies and prayers to the bereaved widow and son, hoping that this afflictive dispensation of Providence will be sanctified to their good.
